WEST HORSLEY PLACE

SHAPED BY CENTURIES AND STORIES

West Horsley Place was the much-loved home of Mary, Duchess of Roxburghe until her death in 2014. To his great surprise, she left the estate to her great-nephew, broadcaster and writer Bamber Gascoigne (1935-2022).

Bamber and his wife Christina recognised not only the historical significance of the place, but also its unique atmosphere - a spirit of creativity, calm, and possibility. They had a clear vision for a future where the estate would be conserved and open for everyone to enjoy, with culture, heritage and nature at its heart; and so the West Horsley Place Trust was born.

We are an extraordinary historic house and estate in the heart of Surrey; with 400 acres of woodland, historic gardens and outbuildings and at the heart of the estate, the 15th century manor house.

Today, the house stands not just as a historic structure, but as a living place whose story continues to unfold. As a charity we have a joint mission: to conserve and protect the heritage in our care, and to enrich people's lives through culture, heritage and nature.
















THE FUTURE AT WEST HORSLEY PLACE

Our intention is to become a national resource for schools and those most in need.

We will create sector leading models for environmental sustainability at rural estates, restoring habitats, enhancing biodiversity and demonstrating nature-based solutions for the future that we hope will be a blueprint for our peers.


